BLOOMINGTON, Ind. – Campus groups are bringing the film Fuel to campus for a free viewing. "Fuel" will start at 6 p.m. Thursday Oct. 13 in the Hutton Honors College Great Room. Union Board, Volunteers in Sustainability, and the Hutton Honors College are co-sponsors to the event.

Marine Temples, membership and outreach coordinator for Volunteers in Sustainability, outlines the film.

"Exploring our dependence on foreign oil, the history of the oil industry and issues we are currently facing as a nation and as a world, 'Fuel' takes an optimistic approach and presents viewers with the hopeful promise of renewable energy."

"Fuel" is 111 minutes long and was first released in 2009.

"While the film introduces many interesting ideas, it also may raise questions for viewers about the feasibility of its proposed solutions," said Temples. "For this reason, attendees are invited to stay after the film for a brief follow-up discussion."
