s I finish up my eight years on the JWS Advisory Board, two as your vice president and six as your president, I want to reflect and share with you the wonderful things we have accomplished.

We just celebrated our fourth IU Day, where JWS members not only connected with other alumni and celebrated our alma mater, but we also raised \$7,500 for Union Board scholarships. JWS awards about \$25,000 in scholarships annually to directors, assistant directors, and committee members on Union Board, and we could not do this without your generous financial support. On behalf of the student recipients, thank you so much for your gifts.

In addition to scholarships, JWS, through your giving, has been able to provide funding for students on Union Board to attend experiences that help enrich their education and help them better serve students. Those experiences include travel to ACUI conferences, the Sundance Film Festival, and Pollstar Live! Entertainment Conference. Students are able to collaborate with other programming boards, learn from professionals in specific industries, and bring back programming ideas.

The Board and the alumni group voted at the last Biennial Reunion to expand our membership eligibility to include assistant directors and committee members. Our goal is to enhance inclusion in our group, and we realized that not everyone who is passionate about Union Board and the IMU is a Union Board Director. This will grow our alumni base and allow us to have even bigger reunions and outreach. In addition, we have worked hard to focus our efforts to promote diversity, starting with the make-up of our Board, to include more women, people of color, and a broad perspective of ideas and experiences. These efforts will only make the John Whittenberger Society stronger, and they help foster greater alumni participation. I am looking forward to our next Biennial Reunion, to be held October 18-20 at the IMU. We hope you can join us, as we will be participating in kick-off efforts celebrating the Bicentennial of Indiana University. Our programming will include a keynote from the Director of IU's Bicentennial Office, Kelly Kish; IMU and campus tours to witness recent updates and upgrades; as well as another special treat: After generous grants from Indiana University and JWS alumni, we will show the world premiere of a documentary on Union Board and the IMU produced and directed by an Emmy Awardwinning documentarian and JWS Board member Jerald Harkness. DAVID D. GIBSON

1963 Union Board President

t was through Sigma Chi fraternity that David D. Gibson got his first taste of what Indiana Memorial Union Board would be like. Fraternity brothers Ray Muston and Bob Hanning were both Union Board members, and they steered Gibson toward signing up as a volunteer committee member in 1960 for one of the campus's biggest events at the time, the Fall Carnival.

"That led to committee work in other areas my sophomore year, and my junior year I was selected to be a Union Board member," he recalled.

He took on a role working on the Auditorium Series, where he would come into contact with then-union director Harold Jordan, "who taught me the importance of attention to detail and followup." Because of this regard, Gibson became a meet-and-greet student representative for some worldly figures who visited IU, including comedian Bob Hope.

By the time he was a senior, Gibson had been elected president of Union Board. And it, at times, presented itself with some incredibly unique challenges: "On November 22, 1963, we had prepared for the bi-annual Union Board reunion, which was then held on the Purdue football weekend. We planned a great program, and I had my speech written to welcome our guests," he recalled. "At noon the world changed when we received word that the president (John F. Kennedy) had been assassinated. Unfortunately, most of our guests had arrived or were in transit. We considered all options, but in the end we went ahead with a modified and somber weekend program."

A chairman emeritus of Gibson Insurance Group and a former officer in the U.S. Army Medical Service Corps after graduating from IU in 1964 with a master's in business administration, Gibson credits his academic and Union Board leadership experiences for his personal and family successes.

"I am convinced that the quality education in the class room from our Business School, combined with the leadership experiences I received as a member of the Union Board, contributed significantly to the opportunities I have had in my business and civic career," Gibson said.

Jennifer Parks Retires from the IMU

ennifer Parks started her career at the IMU in 1992, moving to the Director's Office in 1993. In 1998, she joined the Union Board family.

For 20 years, Jennifer contributed each and every day dedicating her life to Union Board. Her title was Administrative Assistant, but her role and support of Union Board and all students she encountered reached far beyond her job description. Student Involvement Reorganization

niversities are no stranger to departmental, divisional, and other kinds of reorganizations, but the merger of the Office of Student Life and Learning with IMU Activities and Events into the new Student Involvement and Leadership Center is one being roundly cheered.

Center director Mara Dahlgren said: "This has been an exciting merger for us. It brings together two areas that provided similar work to support student life but did not often collaborate. A primary focus of the new Center is to provide experiences through involvement, recreation, and service that help students feel like they belong on campus."

Areas falling under the new Student Involvement and Leadership Center include leadership programs, community engagement, the Crimson Cupboard food pantry, IMU Bowling and Billiards, IU Outdoor Adventures, and student organization advising for groups, including Union Board, IU Student Government, and Funding Board. As part of the change, the center will offer new resources, trainings and workshops for students and their organizations. The aim is to improve the student leadership experience through consistent student organization advising and support along with enhanced leadership education.

Some of the immediate rewards have been improved consistency and efficiency within university student organizations; the opportunity to build stronger partnerships between Student Government, Union Board, and Funding Board; and the creation of new support resources for student organizations leaders.

"We know there are always leadership turnovers in April for student organizations and wanted to provide additional support during this time to develop and train students to lead their organizations. It has been rewarding to offer these opportunities and see students excited to learn more about team development and goal setting," Dahlgren said.

O'Guinn Finds His Passion In New Student Affairs Role at IU

ave O'Guinn says nothing has felt more natural to him than moving from being IU's chief litigation counsel to becoming the new Vice Provost for Student Affairs and Dean of Students at IU Bloomington.

As an undergraduate at DePauw University, one of his mentors was the director of student activities, and he was a union board member as a freshman, progressing on to hold a position on the union board's executive board. His deans and mentors there had gone to IU for graduate school, which played a role in O'Guinn going to graduate school in Bloomington as well.

> "I had a passion for being involved in student activities and what I learned at DePauw was that what I really loved was planning events that weren't parties and that gave students something to do besides going out and drinking," O'Guinn recalled.

> While working on a master's degree in higher education from IU's School of Education, he completed a practicum under former IMU assistant director Mark Guthier. Next, O'Guinn pursued juris doctorate degree from the University of Notre Dame, where he was a special assistant to that school's student union director.

O'Guinn landed his first job out of school planning special events as Quinnipiac College's Assistant Director of the Student Center and Student Activities. He then moved on to Centre College in Kentucky to become its Director of Student Activities and Greek Life.

After a stint in private practice, O'Guinn came on board at IU in 2007 as associate general counsel, was named chief litigation counsel in 2014, and began his new role as vice provost in May 2018.

"I believe we have the greatest union in the world, and I'm proud that my office is here," he said. "It's an honor for me to come to the union every day, and I never lose sight of that."

One of the challenges facing O'Guinn and his staff is taking the rich history and traditions of Indiana Memorial Union and keeping the union experience relevant for today's student. "How do we keep the IMU as the living room of our campus? It's certainly my goal to keep it that way, and I'm looking forward to working closely with Hank to keep it that way," O'Guinn said.

One major step already taken to strengthen student ties to the IMU has been to merge work done by the former office of Student Life and Learning and IMU Activities and Events to create the Student Involvement and Leadership Center. The office includes leadership and community engagement programs, the university food pantry, and student organizations, including Union Board.

"It's just awesome that all of this is now being brought into the union," he said. "This is a major move for the union as an attraction for students."
